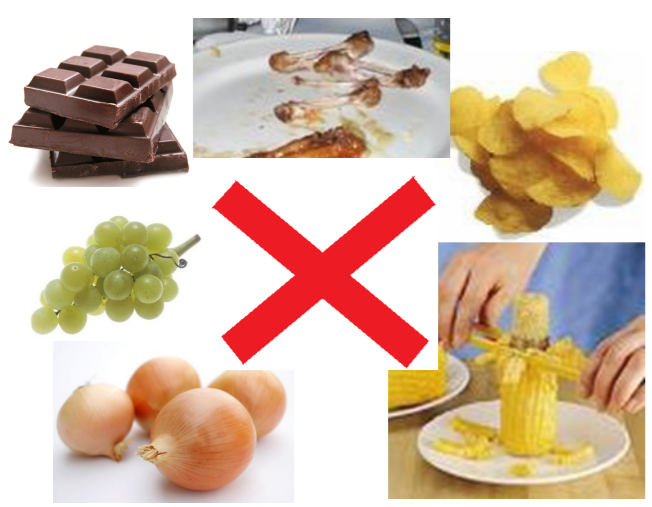


Feeding Dogs



What not to feed?



Chocolate, cooked bones, corn cobs, onions, and grapes can make dogs sick. Sweets and junk food can also be bad for dogs.



Give scraps straight after meals, don't wait for dogs to get them out of the rubbish, or they could get sick.

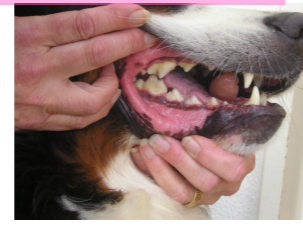
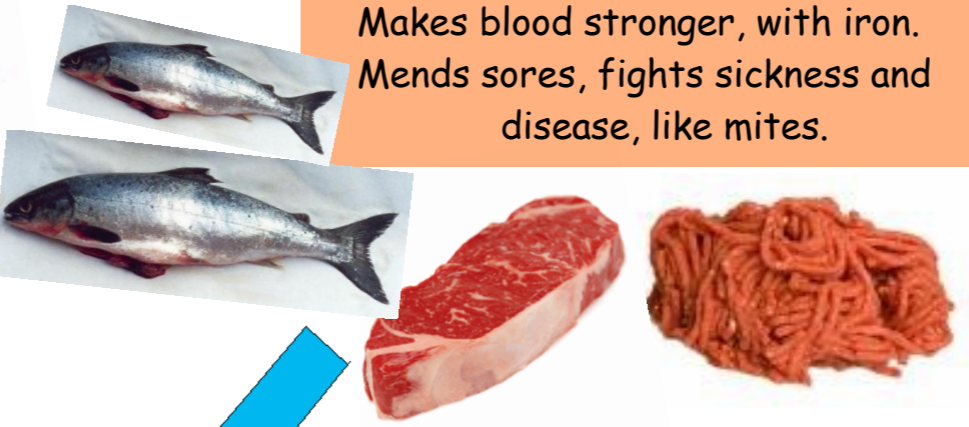
Make sure poisons and medicines can't be eaten by dogs



What to feed?

Meat and Fish
Protein and fat to put on weight
Makes blood stronger, with iron.
Mends sores, fights sickness and disease, like mites.

Bones
Give calcium which is important for making bones and teeth grow well



Vegetables
Veggies are important for dogs to eat. Veggies have vitamins and carbohydrates for energy and to fight sickness

Rice pasta, bread
Carbohydrates for energy, Make them full from eating and to put on weight.



All tinned and dry foods have the right amount of protein, vitamins, minerals and energy to keep dogs healthy



How much to feed?

How much food a dog needs depends on how big they are, and how active they are.
Big dogs like kelpies, dingo cross, and blue heeler need a can of dog food a day, or half a can plus vegetables and table scraps.



Smaller dogs like terriers and Chihuahuas need about half as much

Feeding puppies

Puppies need more protein and calcium because they are growing fast.
They need to drink their mothers milk for at least 6-8 weeks.
Its easiest to feed pups and their mums commercial Puppy food, tinned or dry, from the shop.
